A word from the Archbishop of Canterbury

My letter this month is a statement by the archbishop concerning the ongoing horrors in the Holy Land. Please continue to pray for all those innocent people, especially the children, who have been killed, injured and displaced in this brutal conflict. The hospital that the archbishop mentions is the one that was destroyed in the recent missile attack. Rev'd Ann

Statement by the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Most Revd Justin Welby:

'Pray for the peace of Jerusalem: they shall prosper that love thee' (Psalm 122)

Our grief and shock only grows greater as more devastating news and images emerge from the abhorrent terrorist attacks in Israel. The agonising suffering endured by those who were targeted and their families can scarcely be imagined. Our hearts are broken open by the grief of Israelis and our Jewish brothers and sisters around the world, for whom this trauma and loss stands in the dark and terrible shadow of the worst days of their history.

I beg that those who have been taken hostage are set free into safety, that they and their loved ones might be released from the horror of their captivity. The anger felt by the people of Israel at the cruelty they have experienced is entirely justified. Many around the world share in that anger.

But in the face of a ground offensive in Gaza, I plead that the sins of Hamas are not borne by the citizens of Gaza, who themselves have faced such suffering over many decades. The price of evil cannot be paid by the innocent. Civilians cannot bear the costs of terrorists. International humanitarian law recognises that, for the sake of everyone's humanity, some acts can never be permissible in the chaos of warfare. I pray that Israel does everything it can to limit the harm caused to innocent civilians.

Over two million civilians in Gaza, half of them children, are facing a catastrophe. A humanitarian corridor and convoy are needed as rapidly as possible, as set out in the Geneva Conventions. I pray particularly for the Anglican-run Ahli Arab Hospital and all those caring for the injured, who need medical supplies and generator fuel.

The Archbishop of Canterbury continues ...

I join with the US Secretary of State and others in urging the Israeli government to exercise their right of defence with the wisdom that might break the cycles of violence under which generations have struggled. Amidst the chaos and confusion of war, and as much as is possible, I join the calls for Israel's military response to be proportional and to discriminate between civilians and Hamas.

Pray for the people of Israel, Gaza and the West Bank. Pray for the future of the Holy Land. Pray for those who will weep, and fear, and die tonight.

Lord God, we pray, by your great mercy, defend your children from all perils and dangers of this night.



Landlord TJ Bannatyne (Dave Turner) is struggling to stay afloat during economic uncertainty. As the film begins, the town, previously a mining community that has now plunged into poverty, faces rising tension when Syrian refugees are placed in local homes. While this is met with hostility by the locals, Bannatyne forges a relationship with Yara (Ebla Mari), one of the refugees, and her family, as they organize a food initiative to help the town community.





The 1921 Census for Campsea Ashe

Using the *Find My Past* website, and with support from the Parish Council, the village's Heritage Group has recently analysed the returns for Campsea Ashe.

There were approximately 90 households in the village in 1921, amounting to 394 souls (194 males, 200 females) so the average household size was 4.4 people. The oldest residents were James Ling (89) and Emma Ling (85.) There were 151 youngsters of 18 and below, half of whom were roughly of school age; 28 were infants of 2 years or less. 341 (86%) of villagers were from the East of England, most having been born in Suffolk. 51 specifically declared Campsea Ashe as their birthplace and a further 44 were from the immediately surrounding villages, meaning that a quarter of the village's population originated from within a radius of just 5 miles from Campsea Ashe.

A total of 242 Campsea Ashe residents (just over 60%) declared that they were in employment or otherwise had an 'Occupation', these being predominantly agricultural in nature. Reflecting the prevailing pattern of Farmer/Landowners and Employees, a great many labourers, farmhands, dairy-workers, gardeners and servants worked for a relatively small number of employers, usually under foremanship or supervision.

The one exception to this general pattern was the Great Eastern Railway with the Station ('Wickham Market') and Goods Yard employing a number of skilled and semi-skilled workers. There was little other activity within the village beyond the Church, Public House, School, shop and some modest 'cottage' type businesses such as smallholdings and the blacksmith. Several more residents were independently employed by the District or County local authorities. Restrictive convention in the 1920s meant that almost all women – housewives and mothers regardless of social status - were simply identified with 'Home Duties', and there were 78 such women listed. In very broad terms of 'social class there were about 20-30 'Own Account' and 'professional' persons in Campsea Ashe. Most prominent were the major land-owners, notably The Rt. Hon. J Lowther of the High House and Lord Alastair Graham of Park House (now Chantry Farm), but there were local farmers and business-owners as well; also the Rector (the Rev. Archdeacon Charles Cory), schoolteachers, local authority officers and the Station Master (Frederick Stowe).

At the next level were approximately 50-60 Skilled & Semi-skilled workers such as Farm Bailiffs, Foremen, Business Managers / Supervisorsa builder, bricklayers, cowmen, horsemen and shepherds.



Census Continued ...

Also included here were senior domestic employees – cooks, nursemaids, head gardeners and tradesmen such as dozen or so railway specialists like signalmen, shunters and

plate-layers. This left the majority of villagers, numbering another 80-90, in low-skilled or casual employment: labourers, roadmen, gardeners, domestic servants, shop-assistants and the like. About ten individuals were recorded as retired or unable to work through disability

This, then, is the village profile of 100 years ago, just after the Great War in which 18 of Campsea Ashe's young men sadly lost their lives. Given that the war had such an impact on people's lives throughout Britain, further study to compare this 1921 picture of Campsea Ashe with previous censuses may give an insight into factors such as mobility, the emergence of a 'middle class and the increasing recognition and influence of women. The Campsea Ashe Heritage Group hopes to explore these issues in due course.




