A word from the Archdeacon

Dear All

I've been asked to write this letter as your archdeacon. I'm Archdeacon Jeanette, archdeacon of Suffolk. The archdeaconry isn't actually the whole of Suffolk but covers the eastern side of the county including the Orebeck benefice (but excluding Ipswich which has its own archdeacon!)

First, I want to say how encouraged I am at the enthusiasm and commitment I sense in the parishes to keep things going in the vacancy. Thank you to all those who are enabling this to happen. This new joint magazine is one example, another is the forward-planning of the service rota and I am looking forward to being with you on 4^{th} September in Parham and on Christmas Day at Kettleburgh. Sharing worship with different people in our churches is always a privilege.

As I write, you are working with the Rural Dean, Revd Chris Davey, on your benefice profile which is the key document for potential applicants as together we seek to find a new priest in charge. Your hopes and vision for the future as well as your honest assessment of the challenges all help to build a picture for any incoming priest. We know that there are challenges, but there are also 'green shoots', new possibilities and ways of helping people to engage with faith and God, and it's these that I know you will seek to grow in the coming months. I hope that we can move forward to advertising in the autumn. Please pray for all those involved and for those whom God might be calling to serve amongst you.

And remember Philippians 4:6: "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." You might also like to read verse seven! In God we trust.



MEMORIES OF MERTON FARM, DALLINGHOO

Uncle Ted worked at Merton Farm, just down the road, it was mainly arable and still used horses. I remember there was a big horse pond and an orchard where there was a tree called 'Beauty of Bath', which had a small but delicious apple. (I don't suppose you can get them now ... not commercially viable!)

The kitchen at Merton farmhouse had a big old sink under the kitchen window and a crazy brick floor that sloped down to an outlet just beside the fireplace. The kitchen table was piled high with eggs. When we collected eggs, we had to be careful because the fleas would run up our arm. Once a week the eggs were collected by a van and paid for on the spot. The van went round the cottages, and it didn't matter if you only bought half a dozen. There was a small sitting-room which we were allowed to go in when Mr Harris wasn't there. Sometimes we stayed for tea and ice-cream. The outside loo was housed in a small, old litter-shed (I think this was used for chicks before it became the loo.) The loo itself was a big, metal bucket with a seat and lid. It was called an Elsan and had a chemical in it (a new invention at the time.)

Mr Harris' pride and joy were his dairy herd and electric milking machines. (It must have been in its infancy because hand milking was still being done during the war.) We were told not to go in the milking shed in case a cow kicked us. Mr Harris and Etsy, wore brown overalls (called a slop) and using a small churn from the dairy, poured the warm milk into a high, narrow trough which had cold water running through it. The milk trickled down into a big churn. This was kept in the dairy overnight. Early the next morning the churns were put outside on a high table which was just the right height to go on the lorry which came early to collect them before it got too hot. **Pat Peck**

HARVEST AT MERTON FARM DALLINGHOO

Most of the harvest was cut by binder which turned out the sheaves which we stacked into sixes and eights. This work was called 'shocking' a Suffolk word, elsewhere the sheaves were called 'stooks'. We took no notice of scratched arms and stubble poking through our sockless sandals. Once the sheaves had dried out the men threw the sheaves up into a big trailer with their pitchforks. One man stood on top of the trailer and evened the load. When the empty trailer went back to the farm, we were allowed to ride on it. No health and safety rules then ... but we were as fit as fiddles. Then I remember seeing the first combine harvester pulled by a tractor while Uncle Ted and Mr Uteman bagged up the grain into big sacks which were dropped down a shute to be picked up later.

The corn wasn't thrashed until the winter when the pink thrashing machine came round from farm to farm. Happy days, Happy Memories! By **Pat Peck**



Marlesford Old School Fund

As we near the start of a new academic year, Marlesford Old School Fund invites applications for grants for education purposes from any child who lives in Marlesford. It can give grants to those starting school for the first time, moving on to secondary education or beginning tertiary education, be it university, sixth form college or apprenticeship.

Quiet Lanes Suffolk

This century, the number of vehicles resident in Marlesford has more than doubled. The number of delivery vans buzzing around the village has increased by an order of magnitude in the last five years. Last century, we could probably have walked from Marlesford to Hacheston along the lanes without meeting a car or van. Now, we would expect several vehicles to pass as we walk along. To encourage drivers to take more care on our little roads, Marlesford is one of nearly 300 Suffolk villages to be registered with the Quiet Lanes initiative.

Sponsored by our County Council, signs are being erected at each end of the "U" class roads, showing that these are approved "Quiet Lanes". The slogans of the programme are:

`Expect and Respect' and `When you see this sign, take your time.'

Drivers of motorised vehicles are encouraged to be patient when encountering pedestrians, horse riders, wheelchair users and cyclists. We hope that by the end of this month, all the posts will be in place and the last signs fixed and we hope our Quiet Lanes will be a little bit safer for us all.
